It creates local jobs



DARIEN BUSINESS BY THE NUMBERS

Business land use in Darien accounts for approximately **6.5%** of our total land use and provides approximately **11%** of the City's property tax revenue. While that may seem like a small number, the economic benefits of the local business community are substantial. The City receives significant revenue from the local business community made possible from all of the residents and visitors using businesses in Darien. The following **\$9,702,696** revenues were generated from taxes collected from our business community in 2022:



which provides for police, streets, community development and administrative services.

SALES TAX REVENUE

Sales tax represented **73.4%** of all business taxes collected in Darien in 2022. Below each sales tax category is broken down in terms of sales tax collected. This helps to show why shopping local is so important to our community!

WHAT IS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT?

Economic Development is programs, policies or activities that seek to improve the economic well-being and quality of life for the Darien Community. Though economic development priorities vary, economic development strategies often aim for common, positive results, such as: keeping current businesses and seeking new businesses that complement our current business environment; insure more productive use of property, specifically, examining current vacant land offerings as well as the redevelopment of under used business centers; and promoting our community's assets to businesses seeking to relocate to our community. The City established an Economic Development Committee in 2019, which has assisted City staff in developing and carrying out our economic strategies.

HOW THE CITY HELPS BUSINESSES

The City of Darien views its partnership with the business community as critical to the success of the City and its residents. It is contingent on the City to provide those services which facilitate a business's success, whether it is applying or renewing their license, to assisting an incoming business with their business development plans.

The City has acted to assist businesses, both new and incoming through our Economic Incentive Program. When Chuck's Southern Comforts selected Darien as a location for a new restaurant, the City provided them with economic assistance that facilitated their eventual opening and successful tenure. During the COVID crisis, the City assisted restaurants and bars by returning their Food and Liquor payments from a six month period during 2019. This payment allowed each of these businesses to reopen in June of 2020, and allowed Darien to maintain each of its restaurants and bars.

THE CITY'S COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

A key component of future business growth and economic development is land use planning. This is addressed in the City's comprehensive plan that was updated on November 21, 2022. Prior to the 2022 update, the plan was updated in 2006 and focused on numerous vacant or underutilized "key development" properties. Most of the key development properties identified in the 2006 update have been successfully developed. The priority identified in the 2022 update includes nine areas with a focus at redevelopment of existing commercial centers including mixed-use redevelopment. These areas include:

- Area #1 -Southeast corner of 75th Street and Lemont Road intersection (Chestnut Shopping Center).
- Area #2 Area between and around 75th Street, Plainfield Road, and Clarendon Hills Road intersections. Area includes Darien Community Park, Hinsdale South High School, Tri-State Fire District, Indian Prairie Library, and the Sportsplex.
- Area #3 All four quadrants of 75th Street and Cass Avenue intersection.
- Area #4 Area adjacent to Cass Avenue along its east side, south of Concord Place (Darien Plaza).
- Area #5 Southeast corner of 75th Street and Lyman Avenue intersection (Darien Towne Centre).

- Area #6 Southwest corner of 75th Street and Lyman Avenue intersection (Marketplace at Darien).
- Area #7 Northeast quadrant of Interstate 55 and Lemont Road interchange (Oldfield Triangle).
- Area #8 Area adjacent to Route 83 along its west side, south of 67th Street.
- Area #9 Southwest corner of Lemont Road and 87th Street intersection.

Starting April 1st through the second full week of December, residents can take advantage of weekly yard waste and food scrap collection services (composting) with Lakeshore Recycling Systems (LRS). These services are included in the monthly fee!

Yard waste generally includes leaves, grass cuttings, twigs, small shrubbery clippings, plants and flowers. Limbs should not exceed 4 feet in length and 50 pounds in weight. Branches must be no more than 4 inches in diameter, with the total diameter of the bundle not to exceed 24 inches. Residents can participate by placing yard waste and/or food scraps (there is no need to separate them) in biodegradable paper bags, or in containers and placing

BRANCH PICKUP PROGRAM

The City's Public Works Branch Pickup Program is free for all single-family homes and provides for the collection and disposal of branches from residential properties. Please stack the branches neatly by the curb on the Sunday before the pickup week. The chipper can accept branches up to 6" in diameter.


